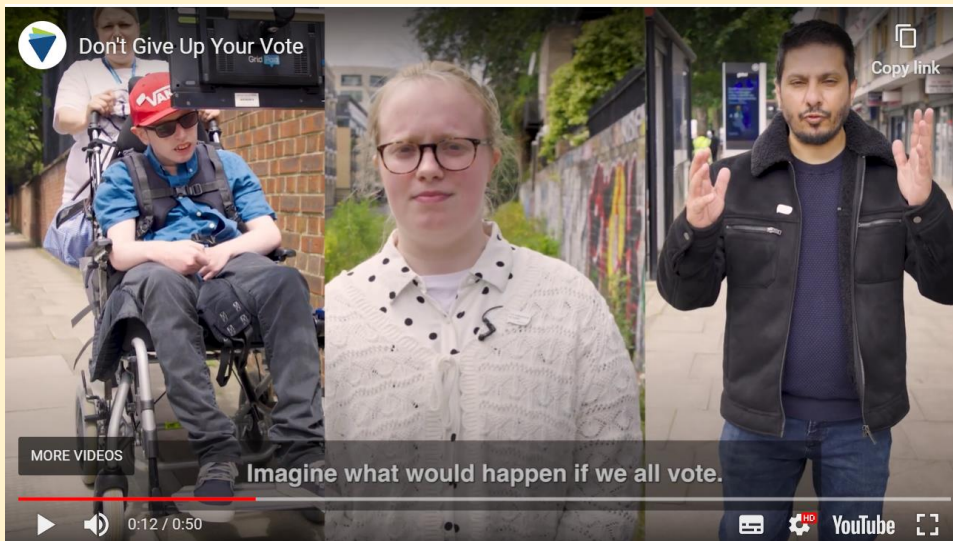

Professional Expert by Experience

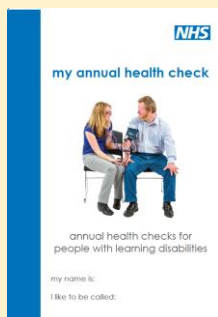
